

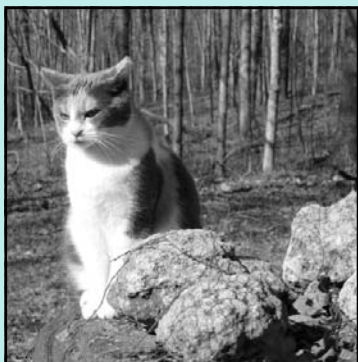
What We Do...

What Are Feral Cats?

Feral Cat: An unsocialized cat who was either born in the wild or was a domestic cat that reverted to a wild state due to the lack of human contact. Adult feral cats usually can't be socialized and won't adjust to living indoors or with a human family.

Feral cats live in streets, alleys, and parks because of human neglect, allowing them to roam and reproduce rapidly. Many people abandon or dump unwanted, unaltered cats, and these often end up in feral colonies.



What Is TNR?

Trap-Neuter-Return: We trap stray, feral, and un-owned cats with humane traps, take them to a veterinarian to be neutered and vaccinated. The cats are returned to their original location and will be managed by a human caregiver who provides food, water and shelter daily.

Why Is TNR The BEST Solution?

Feral Cat Friends, Inc. uses TNR because Trap and Remove only provides a temporary solution to eliminating the feral cat population. With Trap and Remove, other cats will move in to take advantage of the newly available resources and they breed prolifically, quickly forming a new colony.



TNR Works! The breeding stops. Populations are gradually reduced. The annoying behaviors of breeding cats, such as fighting, spraying and yowling stop. The cats are vaccinated and diseases are controlled.
